

The Town Board of Holland met Monday January 2, 2017 at 8pm, Chmn Wall called the meeting to order and the Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

The minutes of the December meeting were read, motion by Sup. VandeWettering was made to approve and seconded by Sup. Geiger. Motion passed.

Old Business:

Sup. Geiger stated that he was in contact with Deyo Disposal regarding a spring cleanup container. Chmn Wall looked into the 1/2 mile of Man-Cal Road shared with the Town of Maple Grove, and the problem was resolved.

Open Forum:

Sup. Geiger spoke on his follow-up with the DNR regarding ATV signage for the town roads. The town ordinance was written correctly and the Wisconsin Towns Association stated that any citation could be thrown out. Atty Sickel stated that ATV's may travel on all town roads, but not on state or county highways. Sup. Geiger got a letter from Rep. Andre Jaques and the WTA in support of the Town of Holland's position. Dennis Stebane questioned if he bought a 6-acre parcel could he build a house there? The board's response that it has to go to the planning board for recommendation and the cost would be \$500 plus he would need a legal description.

New Business:

Sup. Geiger spoke regarding a fire contract. Atty Sickel said that the contract is valid and the town would have to provide service if terminated. He further stated that he would have more information for the next meeting. Mark Vanderloop appeared before the board regarding the building of a warming house and a shed for the zamboni in Hollandtown. The cost would run about \$7500 for a 40 X 70 building. He would come back with more details in the next few months.

Communications and Correspondence:

An email from Andy Hoffman asking if he built a new structure on his property would that qualify him for additional landfill money from the county of Brown? Atty Sickel stated that the values of the affected properties was set by an outside appraisal firm from Madison. He further stated that he didn't think the county or the town would re-open the settlement agreement and would respond to Mr. Hoffman's letter of December 12, 2016.

Any other business:

Gloria Kennedy stated that the contract with the county for the collection of tax money was due this February. A motion to approve the contract was made by Sup. VandeWettering, seconded by Sup. Geiger. Motion passed. Treasurer Kennedy informed the board that a one-time payment of \$11,747.00 was made by the American Transmission Company.

Payment of Bills:

After review of bills, a motion was made by Sup. Geiger and allowed Treasurer Kennedy to pay bills that would be due after the January 2, 2017 meeting, seconded by Sup. VandeWettering. Motion passed.

Motion to adjourn was made by Sup. VandeWettering, seconded by Sup. Geiger. Meeting adjourned.
