

The Town Board of Holland met on Monday April 2, 2018 at 8pm.

Chmn Wall called the meeting to order, the Pledge of Allegiance was recited. The minutes of the last meeting were read, a motion was made by Sup. Geiger to approve them, seconded by Sup. VandeWettering. Motion passed.

Old Business: Sup. Geiger stated that the A.T.V. legislation reducing the signage for the town will be passed this week in Madison. Ed Born questioned the amount of money being spent for landfill attorneys. Sup. Geiger responded that this is the time the groundwork to protect the residents of the Town of Holland has to be done, and if Mr. Born has any better ideas he is open to hear them. Atty James Sickel stated that if digesters come there will be zoning issues involved, also how would this effect the residents and the environment.

Next, Evan Koehler regarding driveway: Atty Sickel reviewed the plan of the driveway and stated the town has no regulations on farm driveways and if the two parties can agree on the driveway civil action is the final action.

Next, the C.F.M. of Ralph and Roxanne Bohrtz. Atty Sickel stated the proposed property would have to be rezoned and this could be done at the next town meeting after public notice is done and a public hearing is held and the planning board gives the approval and the town board acts on the recommendation.

Next, Deyo Contract: Changes were made to the contract to be extended from 5 years to 7 years and a rate of \$11.59 to be established. Also, a fuel charge would be added if diesel price is above \$3.00 per gallon. A motion to approve the contract was made by Sup. Geiger, seconded by Sup. VandeWettering. Motion approved.

Next, Payment of Bills: After review of bills, a motion by Sup. Geiger to approve the bills, seconded by Sup. VandeWettering. Motion passed.

Next, Any other matters: Chmn Wall stated that a "Deaf Children's sign at play" sign will be placed on Wayside Road, 1/4 west of County PP.

Being no other business, a motion to adjourn was made by Sup. VandeWettering, seconded by Sup. Geiger. Meeting adjourned
