

The Town Board of Holland met on June 3, 2019 at 7pm at Van Abel's.

Also present was the Town of Holland Local Monitoring Committee.

Chmn Wall called the meeting to order and the Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

The minutes of the last meeting were read and a motion to approve them was made by Chmn Wall and seconded by Sup. Geiger. Motion passed 3-0.

Old Business: None

Open Forum: Briana Zankowski can't get the water problem solved. She has approached the board several times and the water does not drain properly, also the owner of the property next door won't let a ditch be put in. Atty Sickel stated the neighbor is creating a nuisance on her property. She could file a nuisance (private action). Atty Sickel doesn't know all of the facts to give his opinion. He further stated get me the facts tomorrow and I will get back to you.

New Business: Planning Board member Pete Colwell stated he is no longer able to serve on the planning board. Chmn Wall stated that that alternative would be to have Mr. Huss assume his position.

Next, presentation of Brown County Solid Waste. Dean Haen gave an overview of the Brown County South Landfill with a powerpoint presentation. Showing the different stages of the proposed project. He answered questions regarding truck routes, operating hours, rodent control, gas collection and what all might be housed on the location. He also stated that daily covering would be done and there would be continuing monitoring of the test wells, wetlands and private wells. Also, the site will need fencing, roads, a truck station to check loads and a weigh station. Atty Merck questioned if there would be a separate cell for special waste? He was informed that the PCBs have been landfilled in Chilton and none would be coming here. Mr. Haen stated that BOW (Brown Outagamie & Winnebago) has worked well to keep things efficient and fiscally responsible. A question was asked if the town has the authority to inspect? Mr. Haen stated yes.

Next, Steve Deslauries asked if the county have a more simpler form for the LMC to understand the info that is given to them and readily accessible. Mr. Haen stated that they would try to improve on communication.

Next, Wayne Micke: His appearance was postponed until the next meeting.

Next, alcohol license The clerk asked the board that when all of the applications were in and they were all in order and no violations incurred he would like permission to issue. Motion by Chmn Wall, seconded by Sup. Geiger stating that if all things were in order the clerk could issue the license. Motion carried 3-0.

Payment of bills: After review of bills, a motion to pay them was made by Sup. Geiger, seconded by Sup. VandeWettering. Motion passed 3-0.

Next, Towns Association resolution: Atty Sickel stated that the Town of Holland in order to be in good standing with the Wisconsin Towns Association-Brown County branch is required to pass the resolution to become a member of the Wisconsin Towns Association-Brown County unit.

Next, Any other matters. The clerk informed the board there is a meeting regarding the purchase of the new voting machines for the handicapped on Wednesday June 5 at 9am at which the 2 chief inspectors and himself will report back to the board on the information presented.

Next, Sup. Geiger made the motion to adjourn the LMC. The minutes of the public hearing held May 16, 2019 were presented to the board to be read at their convenience and then at the next town meeting they can make corrections if needed and they could make the motion to approve those minutes.

Being no other business, a motion to adjourn was made by Sup. VandeWettering, seconded by Sup. Geiger. Meeting adjourned.
