

September 2018 Minutes
Town of Holland

The Town Board of Holland met Tuesday September 4, 2018 at 8pm.

Chmn Wall called the meeting to order, the Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

The minutes of the August meeting were read, a motion to approve them was made by Sup. VandeWettering, seconded by Sup. Geiger. Motion passed.

There was no old business, and no new business.

Open Forum: A question was asked regarding the speed at Rocky Top and the park?
Chmn Wall stated the approaches would be signed at 35 mph and stop signs would be installed at Z and St. Pat's Road, and at Z and D. Matt Verbeten questioned when the county would be testing more wells. Sup. VandeWettering stated the county should send a notice to the well owners in the effected area on the status of their wells. Sup. VandeWettering made the motion to entertain looking at a lawsuit against the county to have the county communicate all information to the town regarding landfill updates, seconded by Sup. Geiger. Motion passed.
Atty Sickel suggested there should be a closed session to evaluate the situation and what procedures to follow.

Next, a discussion on the pros and cons regarding the digesters was discussed.
Sup. Geiger stated that of the four he has checked, none of them are functioning properly.

Next, Dan Teeters from Brown County Planning stated that the revisions the board has made will be incorporated in the comp plan. Atty Sickel has sent a letter to Dan Nemke of BC Biometrics to correct the future land use map and pdf. There was some concern on the board regarding the hauling of manure from other counties.

Next, Payment of Bills - After review of bills, a motion by Sup. Geiger to pay them, seconded by Sup. VandeWettering. Motion passed.

Communications - The clerk reported that Arla, the cheese plant in Hollandtown is questioning the assessed value of their plant with the state of Wisconsin and no outcome has been finalized.

Being no other business, a motion to adjourn was made by Sup. Geiger, seconded by Sup. VandeWettering. Meeting adjourned.
