

Town of Holland  
October 2018 Meeting

The Town Board of Holland met Monday October 1, 2018 at 8pm.  
Chmn Wall called the meeting to order and the Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

The minutes of the last meeting were read, a motion to approve was made by Sup. VandeWettering, seconded by Sup. Geiger. Motion passed.

Old Business: Atty Sickel gave a report on the digesters. He introduced Atty Treesie Kamps from the firm the town has hired to do an environment assessment of the biodigesters and the Conditional Use Permit. Atty Sickel stated that our approach has to be with the air quality, trucking, congestion with traffic, smell, noise, etc... and operating hours. Atty Kamps gave a vision of how her firm would be involved in the checking of the C.U.P.

The board decided to hold an informational meeting at Van Abel's to discuss with BC Dynamic and have the public participate at 7pm on October 23, 2018. A motion by Sup. Geiger was made to send out a mailing informing the residents of the date, place and time, seconded by Sup. VandeWettering. Motion passed.

Next, Chmn Wall suggested that the 35 mph and stop signs to be installed at St. Pat's Church Road and County Hwy Z for safety. Sup. Deslauries suggested the county highway commissioner would come out with a plan in two months for a solution that would be more agreeable to the residents. A motion by Sup. VandeWettering to hold off for 2 months and see what the highway department would come up with, seconded by Sup. Geiger. Motion passed by 2 votes with 1 abstention.

Next, Mark Kiel reported the yard waste piling up in the Hollandtown Park was a problem and that the chipper failed to come and grind the residue. Chmn Wall stated that he would call the county and take care of this.

Next, Kerry Ambrose asked the board if the billing from the county highway department contained all the information that the town needed? The only thing that the board stated could be more specific on date and number of personnel at specific sites.

New Business: Atty Sickel stated that the board was not informed in a timely manner by Brown County and reporting was a problem. Also, it is in the contract with the county that they must report to the board in person 2 times per year.

Next, culvert policy: Atty Sickel suggested that the board set a policy to have everyone apply for a culvert permit from the town if needed. Motion by Sup. VandeWettering to approve, seconded by Sup. Geiger. Motion passed.

Payment of Bills: After review of bills a motion was made by Sup. Geiger to pay them, seconded by Sup. VandeWettering. Motion passed.

Being no other business, a motion by Sup. Geiger to adjourn, seconded by Chmn Wall. Meeting adjourned.
