

The Town Board of Holland met on Monday November 7, 2016 at 8pm.

All members were present, Chmn Wall called the meeting to order and the Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

The minutes of the last meeting were read and a motion to approve was made by Sup. Geiger, seconded by Sup. VandeWettering. Motion approved.

Old Business: Fire Department Recovery Ordinance

The motion to postpone until next month was made by Sup. VandeWettering, seconded by Sup. Geiger. Motion Approved.

Open Forum:

Connie Leon (Rocky Top) asked that she would submit a bill for materials and Bob Rotzenberg would submit his bill to the board. She further stated that the ditch was filled for safety reasons and asked why Mr. Bruecker didn't say anything to her before she went ahead with the project. She then thanked the people for all their support, Mr. Bruecker stated that he didn't want it there and his insurance would be canceled.

Ed Born asked if solar speed signs could be put up and at what cost?

The chairman stated that they could run between \$3000-5,000.

A resident questioned who owns the pond on Windmill and Wooden Shoe, the chairman stated that it belongs to the developer Darboy Stone. This person also wants the dumping on the vacant lots to stop. Atty Sickel stated that the town could give notice and issue citations.

A resident asked to have the double yellow safety lines in the 30 mph moved to the Leo Gerrits property.

The chairman stated the posts for the fire signs have been installed.

Budget Hearing: The budget hearing will be held at 7pm Thursday November 17.

Payment of Bills: After review, a motion to pay the bills was made by Sup. Geiger, seconded by Sup. VandeWettering. Motion passed.

Any other matters: Sup. Geiger stated there could be 400 ATV signs required if the DNR gets their way. He explained that the city of Brillion doesn't need them. Atty Sickel stated that we have an ATV ordinance on the books.

A motion to adjourn was made by Sup. VandeWettering, seconded by Sup. Geiger.
