

The Town Board Holland met November 12 at 8pm. Chmn Wall called the meeting to order and the Pledge of Allegiance was recited. The minutes of the last meetings were read, a motion by Sup. Geiger to approve, seconded by Chmn Wall. Motion passed.

Old Business: regarding C.U.P. and BC Dynamics was moved to Item #9

Open Forum: Marty Adams asked how we can stop expansion of these dairy herds. There is not enough land for all of the animals, nothing is being done to halt the growth. Kewaunee County has bad wells and there should be an ordinance for non-compliance of \$10,000. All fees for training should be covered by the C.U.P., also citation fees should be higher than the county.

New Business: none

Next, action on the comp plan Sup. VandeWettering made the motion to adopt the ordinance 62-23, seconded by Sup. Geiger. Motion passed.

Next, Communications; County Supervisor Steve Deslauries stated in his letter, his opposition to BC Dynamics. There was a public hearing on 10-24 at Van Abel's in Hollandtown at which 100 people were informed as to what BC Dynamics proposal involved. Atty Sickel stated that more information will be sought and see what our ordinance will permit. There will be specific areas of inquiry to look at. There will be another public hearing at which the C.U.P. would focus on discharge of the water into a nearby creek. Things to consider are; cost of transportation, trips per day, noise impact, legal fees for monitoring. Another update for emergency management, accidental spills, overflow of the birm, permit for non-compliance, keep records of all violations, monitor all flaring gas, check plans and odor patrol. Check on waste water discharge, and if it doesn't comply we can't accept that. all of these conditions will be presented to the planning board to be held at a public hearing. Sup. Geiger asked how can this company run a facility that has failed? How was this corrected? If they fail they must have a bond to fix or take it down. Sup. Geiger also asked if this could mean more manure would be coming to the community. Company engineer Dan Nemke would like long term control over the operation. Sup. Geiger questioned could farmers double their herds? Dan Nemke stated the DNR would not permit this. Marty Adams stated digesters smell and goes up in the air, Sanimax gets loads of restaurant waste. Sup. Geiger wanted to know where the quart of clear water came from. Sup. Geiger complimented the local farmers and how they handled their waste. Marty Adams stated that some fields get up to three or four times more than required amounts of manure. Atty Sickel questioned if industrial digesters would be built in the town, also who would pay for nutrient plan from the digesters? Also, if emergencies occurred would storage be available at the digesters? Answer: Yes. Marty new manure producers cut back. Sup. Geiger stated costs to monitor with no taxes on the property is too much burden on the town. A question was asked about payment in lieu of taxes? Marty Adams stated prices go down when farmers expand. Atty Sickel suggested that we hire Thomas Cretney for approximately at \$60/hour for 10-15 hours who is a mechanical environmental engineer to assist the town. Motion by Sup. VandeWettering, seconded by Sup. Geiger. Motion passed.

A motion by Sup. Vande Wettering to have the budget hearing one half-hour before the December meeting.

After review of bills, a motion to pay them was made by Sup. Geiger, seconded by Sup. VandeWettering. Motion passed.

Being no other business a motion by Sup. VandeWettering to adjourn, seconded by Sup. Geiger. Meeting adjourned.
