## YARD WASTE COLLECTION DATES AND INFORMATION

The Yard Waste Program in the Town of Holland has become a popular program used by many of our residents. The dumpster is located at the south end of the parking lot at the community park on County Rd D in Hollandtown, and is open from 8 am until 12 pm (noon) on the following Saturdays:

April 20*	July 20	October 5*
May 18 (also Appliance Recycle Date)	August 17	October 19*
June 15	September 14	November 2* (cancelled if snowing)

Dates marked with asterisk will have an area set aside for branches only. These will later be chipped up by Brown County. Anyone wishing to receive the wood chips can contact Brown County. They are free.

Accepted yard waste includes, but is not limited to:

Branches (less than 6" diameter)	Grass Clippings	Leaves
Hay/straw	Brush	Shrubs

- Only yard & garden waster, and small brush will be accepted.
- Yard waste must be in paper bags or trash cans for dumping. NO PLASTIC BAGS of any kind will be accepted.
- Grass clippings will be accepted, however, the Town of Holland and the DNR encourage residents to leave the grass clippings on the lawn as a good source of fertilizer.
- The dumpster will be locked before and after the times listed above
- No other items will be accepted.
- Items left outside the dumpster after hours will be subject to a \$200 fine per town ordinance.

## SPRING RECYCLING EVENT

Open to all Town of Holland Residents.

Saturday, May 18, 2019 from 8 am until noon at the Hollandtown Community Park in Hollandtown (County D), the following items for recycling will be accepted:

Free Items Include: Computer towers, laptops, cell phones, servers/routers, wire and cable, mouse, copiers, printers fax machines, phone systems DVD/VCR, stereos, CD players, rechargeable batteries, washers, dryers, stoves, household appliances – big and small, anything metal.

Freon items also accepted.

Items For a Fee Include: Monitors \$10; TV and LCD TV's under 30" - \$15; TV's over 30" - \$30; Console TV's \$30.

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## **NOTICE TO ALL BROWN COUNTY DOG OWNERS**

Pursuant to Section 174.052, Wisconsin Statutes, rabies vaccinations and dog licenses are required for all dogs who are 4 months of age or older.

Vaccinations against rabies are required, Section 95.21 (2), Wisconsin Statutes within 30 days after the dog reaches 4 months of age and shall be repeated within one year after the initial vaccination. In addition, dogs shall be revaccinated when their rabies certificate expires. A certificate documenting that the dog's rabies vaccinations are current shall be presented to the town treasurer when obtaining an annual dog license.

The owner of a dog more than 5 months of age on January 1 or within the licensing year, shall obtain an annual dog license.

2019 dog license tags can be obtained from your local municipal treasurer. Fees are \$4 for spayed or neutered dogs, and \$9 for those not spayed or neutered. To obtain your 2019 Dog License, please mail payment, payable to the Town of Holland, along with vaccine certification from your veterinarian to Gloria Kennedy, 7928 St. Pat's Church Road, Greenleaf, WI 54126.

## **A WORD FROM OUR COUNTY SUPERVISOR**

Hello Holland Families,

I wanted to share with you some recent good news for District 20.

\* After years of planning by the Village, the 'Village of Denmark Business Development Corridor' resolution was passed unanimously at March's Brown County Board meeting. 'Phase One' of this project will bring our District over 80 new permanent jobs with Salm Partners building a new 35 million dollar 80,000 square foot production and storage facility, Kwik Trip building a new convenience store, and the construction of the infrastructure to support other planned improvements including a new hotel. All of this strategically located just off Interstate 43. I was honored to be part of this effort.

\* As many of you know, I took issue with Brown County not communicating to Holland families about the contamination of over 20 wells at the future landfill site in Holland. After I found out about this last July (7 months after the contamination), I made sure that neighbors as well as the proper agencies were notified and I have worked diligently to get in place a policy to ensure this silence will never happen again. Brown County has agreed to a timely communication plan for any future contamination event at the Holland site.

I sit on Brown County's 'Planning, Development and Transportation Committee' (oversees the Public Works and Highway Departments) and the 'Land Conservation Committee'. As always, I welcome your input on any Brown County matter - call or write me any time. I would be happy to share with you the other efforts I am currently working on. It has been a very busy first year as your County Board Supervisor. I continue to learn and genuinely believe that things are moving in the right direction with better collaboration between Brown County and District 20 Municipalities including the Town of Holland.
