

Garbage:

Garbage Schedule for 2018:

The Town of Holland will provide a container for your garbage which will be picked on every Tuesday. Please place your cart on the curb at the end of your driveway by 5:00 a.m.

Recycling:

Recycling Schedule for 2018:

January	2 & 16 & 30	July	3 & 17 & 31
February	13 & 27	August	13 & 28
March	12 & 27	September	11 & 25
April	10 & 24	October	9 & 23

June	5 & 19	December	4 & 18

Change of Collection Date:

If the collection date falls on a holiday, collection will be on the Wednesday

Do not park or place cart within 4'ft of any object.(I.e.; utility poles, mailbox, or vehicles).

Cart must be at least 4"ft apart or on separate sides of your driveway.

Carts placed on snow banks will not be serviced.

Carts improperly placed, may be tagged and left unemptied.

The Town of Holland will recycle your cardboard, magazines, newspapers, aluminum, and plastic (#1 & #2 only). Plastic bottles with necks will now be accepted (such as Ketchup). Recyclables should be placed in the Recycle Cart provided for you. Pick up is on the second and fourth Tuesday of the month. Please place your carts on the curb at the end of your driveway by 5:00 am.

Use of Town Recycling Containers at the Town Hall:

The bins are available on the 4th Saturday of the month from 9am until 1pm.

Items to be Recycled:

All Recyclables will go in your recycle cart.

1: Co-Mingled Recyclables: Should be placed loosely in the bin provided to you-please do not bag. Aluminum, Steel Cans, Bi-metal Cans, Glass and #1 and #2 plastic. Please clean items of residue.

2: Paper/Cardboard Mixes: Loose paper, i.e. magazines, books, junk mail, envelopes, phone books, writing paper, and newspaper should be placed in grocery bags or boxes to keep contained.

3: Paint cans: You can recycle well-rinsed, dried, #5(steel) paint cans with lids removed. There should be little or no paint in the can.

New Items that can be recycled: (*Effective December /2014*)

4: Cartons (milk, juice, soup, wine, etc.) Dairy containers (yogurt, sour cream, margarine, cottage cheese, etc.).

5: Produce, Bakery, and deli containers (berry, donut, potato salad, etc.). Lids from above containers.

DO NOT place your recyclables in plastic bags, this is a major source of contamination and causes material processing issues. Keep recyclables loose in your recycling cart, with the exception of paper. Place paper in paper bags and staple shut.
Plastic bags are acceptable for recycle at participating retail locations.

Computers and Electronics:

These should not be taken to the dump. There are many contaminants in old PC's and monitors, including, but not limited to, lead, chromium, and mercury.

However we suggest you discard your old equipment using one of these methods:

Donations: Check with local churches, youth groups, schools or clubs.

Computer Resale: Check the local phone book for computer retailers that may be interested in purchasing or taking your old equipment for refurbishing.

Computer Recycling: Recycling firms are available who disassemble computers and sell the reclaimed materials. They may charge a fee for their services. Look under recycling centers in the yellow pages.

Computers are also accepted for recycling at the Brown County Household Hazardous Waste Facility. Contact the Recycling Hotline at (920) 448-4400, option 5, for more information.
