

[There was a special meeting of the Town of Holland on August 28, 2018 at 8pm with the purpose of revisions of the town comp plan.](#)

The town board approved the following:

1. Chapter 1 Page 6 the last bullet point above the heading natural, cultural and agricultural resources goal should read as follows-protect the health and safety of Holland residents when considering any future energy projects.
2. Chapter 2 Page 6 under landfill ability heading the following change:
The second sentence which starts with upon should be removed from the paragraph.
3. Chapter 2 Page 24 the last bullet point on that page under new development which is the heading on the previous page should be totally deleted.
4. Chapter 6 Page 14 under other forms of power generation, the town board determined to eliminate the entire first paragraph that speaks to wind energy. The second paragraph would read as follows: Considering the significant impact upon the town regarding the citing and operation of power generating facilities in Brown County, it is possible that the town consider the health and public safety of it's residents when considering any future facility proposal. The town should also keep abreast of any legislative or legal changes to the citing and or operations of facilities in the town and make appropriate changes to adopted plans and/or ordinances where appropriate. The entire third paragraph of that section as suggested on 8-15-2018 would be deleted.
5. Chapter 6 Page 19 the fourth bullet point from the bottom of the heading summary of recommendations, policies and programs would be eliminated. The third bullet from the bottom of the page would read as follows: the town should protect the public health and safety when considering energy production facilities.

Those are the changes the town requests to be made to the draft.

[We look forward to the receipt of the next draft so that we can keep on our schedule in regard to the public hearing on 10/1/18 and your presentation at the 9-4-2018 town meeting.](#) Atty Sickel noted that when he looked at our schedule he did not know if we will make the public hearing date because of the required public notice appears to provide for a 30 day review period that would have to have been published 8-27-18 to have the public hearing on 10-1-18. The date may have to be pushed back to provide for the public notice review period.

At this meeting, it was decided to put on the agenda for the 9-4-18 meeting any information regarding advice from the environmental group that Atty Sickel could have contacted.
